The Indiana University Jacobs School of Music Percussion Ensemble traces its inception back to 1960 with the appointment of Distinguished Professor of Music and PAS Hall of Famer George Gaber. Since that time the ensemble has explored and performed historically relevant chamber repertoire in addition to contemporary and commissioned works. The IU Jacobs School of Music percussion ensemble performs 2 concerts each semester and regularly collaborates with distinguished guest artists and IU faculty. This is the ensemble's third appearance at PASIC.

In addition to studying with a world-class percussion faculty, our percussion students enjoy a variety of performance opportunities including: 5 symphony orchestras, opera and ballet orchestras, 3 wind ensembles, new music ensemble, marching band, percussion ensemble, Afro-Cuban, Brazilian, and steel pan ensembles along with jazz big bands and combos.

Students in the BM, BME, BSOF, MM, and DM programs are trained in virtually every aspect of percussion performance including: orchestral percussion and timpani, solo percussion, marimba, chamber percussion, drum set, jazz vibes and world percussion.

The percussion department faculty studios, graduate assistant offices, and dedicated percussion practice rooms now reside in the East Studio Building. This state of the art facility provides technologically and acoustically superior teaching and practice facilities to rival any music school or conservatory in the world.
